

Our first event in 2025 **Community Concert**

We are asking once more for volunteers to perform (either musical or reading poetry) — pieces should preferably more no more than 5 or 6 minutes and no auditions are required. If you would like to take part, please email concert@stjudeschurch.info. Many of you reading this will remember from previous years one of my very favourite Christmas moments. It's when a child taking part in our St Jude's Christmas Eve Crib Service releases a helium star balloon into the church rafters. The star symbolises the star that first led the wise men to the infant Jesus, over 2000 years ago. It will often hang there in the beams almost until Easter, a lovely reminder that God invites us still today to follow the star that leads us to him.

Between them our Christmas services aim to reflect many aspects of the glorious message of Christmas. We begin on Saturday 21st December at 3.00pm with our Blue Christmas Service. It is an opportunity for those of us who perhaps find Christmas in some ways difficult, to gather for a short time of quiet thoughtfulness. At the very heart of Christmas is the God who longs to meet with us in our deepest sorrows and our greatest fears. Christmas is not all glitter — it can be overshadowed for many by sadness, loneliness, pain and loss. Please come and join us in this simple act of remembrance, reflection and hope.

The following day, Sunday 22nd December at 4.00pm is our annual Christmas Carol Service. The service will be led by Professor Geoff Chew and the St Jude's Choir, augmented by Guy Bunce and the Allegra Choir. The carol service always reminds me that some of the most beautiful music ever written was inspired by Christian celebration. In its own way the music of Christmas ignites the star that will lead us one day to that place of "one equal music" where the once infant Jesus now reigns in glory.

On Christmas Eve, Tuesday 24th December at 4.00pm we come to our Christmas Crib Service, led for us as in many previous years by one of our churchwardens, Mrs Claudia Tubb. It is a special opportunity for many children to take part and to bring to new life the events of the first Christmas. Props and costumes are provided — please arrive in good time and there may well be a part for you to play! This is a real family service — and a wonderfully vivid reminder of the Holy Family met together in love long ago in the stable of Bethlehem.

At 11.30pm on Christmas Eve our Midnight Holy Communion service ushers in the new day of Christmas celebration, completed on Christmas morning by our 8am service of Holy Communion (said) and our family Holy Communion at 9.30am. In the grateful sharing of Holy Communion we recall that the earthly life journey of Jesus began in a stable but ended on a scaffold. The story of Jesus is the story of God's unfailing love for the world. It is also a story that is unfinished. The cross of Jesus led to the crown of glory and one day every star will shine more brightly as Jesus, the King of Kings, returns to claim his Kingdom.

May God bless you this Christmas and may the star of his love ever lead you to him. Judith Allford
